What to Expect

Upon Entry: After submitting your entry form and paying the entry fee, you will receive confirmation of your participation in the Pageant. Please keep all information regarding the Pageant together and in a safe place for easy reference. Remember to represent Job's Daughters proudly during public events and functions by displaying your best conduct and enthusiasm, especially during official Job's Daughters activities.

Preparation & Qualification:

- All entrants must complete their Proficiency Lessons Examination in their Bethel before the date of the Pageant to qualify for the title.
- Refer to the Rules and Regulations for Miss Queensland found on the website for more details about qualifications.
- Decide on appropriate attire for the day—business attire for judging day and a modest, well-fitting formal outfit for the crowning night.
- Study your Ritual and Job's Daughters Rules and Regulations and general knowledge materials to prepare for the Ritual Recitation and Written Test.

Judging Day:

The day will start with a welcome session where you can meet the Youth Leaders, Pageant Team, Judges and fellow contestants.

Activities include:

Written Test: A test based on general knowledge of Job's Daughters.

Ritual Recitation: Given in the regalia of a Floor Officer, judged on accuracy and presentation.

Interview: Judges will assess your personality, diction, sincerity, manners, and general knowledge.

Social Etiquette: Judged on your table manners, social conversation, and ability to relate to others with dignity, grace, and humility.

Pageant Night:

Stage Presentation: After a day of judging, you'll change into your formal attire for the evening presentation. All entrants will be introduced, and the MC may ask you a question or two for the audience to get to know you better.

Final Question: Judged not only on your response to a question but also on the overall impression you make as you respond. (Miss Qld Entrants Only)

Winners will be announced and crowned in the following order: Junior Miss Queensland Job's Daughter and Miss Queensland Job's Daughter.

Post-Crowning:

Congratulations! After the winners are announced, you'll be escorted for photographs with the Past Miss Queensland Job's Daughters, your family, and the Jurisdictional Guardian. Once the photos are done, return to celebrate with friends and family.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The role of Miss Queensland Job's Daughter is a prestigious and impactful position within our Jurisdiction, offering a unique opportunity for leadership and personal growth.

As a titleholder, you will serve as an ambassador for Job's Daughters Queensland, exemplifying the values of our organization and inspiring members across the state. This role involves not only representing Job's Daughters at various events and ceremonies but also leading by example through community service, mentorship, and active participation in promoting our mission.

While not every contestant will become Miss Queensland Job's Daughter, participating in the Pageant provides invaluable experience and development. Winning this title is a significant achievement, but it also marks the beginning of a year filled with responsibilities and opportunities to make a lasting difference. Your journey as Miss Queensland will help you build leadership skills, create meaningful connections, and contribute to the growth and success of Job's Daughters in Queensland.



Miss Queensland Job's Daughter shall:

- (a) Whenever possible, visit Bethels, Queensland State Bethel and other Daughter-related activities to promote the good of the Order.
- (b) Whenever possible, represent Job's Daughters at Masonic-related functions and other events when requested to do so by the Jurisdictional Guardian.
- (c) Work in conjunction with the JGC in preparing the Annual Pageant and be given the opportunity to showcase her term by providing the theme of the pageant and assisting with the stage decorations.
- (d) Compile a term plan in consultation with the Jurisdictional Guardian and within thirty (30) days of her crowning.
- (e) Submit in writing to the Jurisdictional Guardian for her approval, the report she intends to deliver at the crowning of her successor. This report shall be submitted at least one (1) week prior to the Pageant Crowning.
- (f) When possible, crown the incoming Miss Queensland Job's Daughter.
- (g) Attend the JGC Annual Meeting for the purpose of making a report and engaging in discussion about the time she has served as Miss Queensland Job's Daughter, including but not limited to any problems she has encountered and suggestions for the future.

Junior Miss

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The role of Junior Miss Queensland Job's Daughter is both an honour and an opportunity for growth within our Jurisdiction.

As a titleholder, you will serve as a role model for junior members, embodying the values and spirit of Job's Daughters.

This role is designed to introduce you to the Miss Queensland Job's Daughter Pageant, offering a supportive and less stressful environment to gain experience and confidence.

While not every contestant will become Junior Miss Queensland, participation in the Pageant provides valuable personal insights and development. Regardless of the outcome, your involvement in the Pageant is a meaningful step in your journey, helping you learn more about yourself and how you navigate various challenges.



e) Duties of Junior Miss Queensland Job's Daughter:

The JMQJD will be empowered to fulfill the following duties:

- (i) Lead and assist with planning at Jobie to Bee events under the guidance of the Jurisdictional Beekeeper/Queen Bee.
- (ii) Serve as a role model when participating in Bethel and Jurisdictional activities.
- (iii) Represent Job's Daughters at events and promoting the organization's values.
- (iv) As the outgoing JMQJD, support and encourage the JMQJD entrants during their Pageant Day.
- (v) Assist in the crowning of the incoming JMQJD.

Charity Coordinator

The role of Job's Daughters Queensland Charity Coordinator has been an important part of our history, giving young members the chance to lead charitable projects and represent Job's Daughters Queensland with pride. Over the years, Miss Charity titleholders have inspired philanthropy, raised community awareness, and made a real difference through their service.

As per the new Supreme Law, this position has now transitioned to the role of Job's Daughters Queensland Charity Coordinator. The role continues the same values of philanthropy, leadership and community service - providing opportunities to plan and lead projects, raise awareness, and represent our organisation at events throughout the year.

This change allows us to focus on year-round charitable work while still honouring the contribution and legacy of our past Miss Charity titleholders.

Practice, Practice, Practice

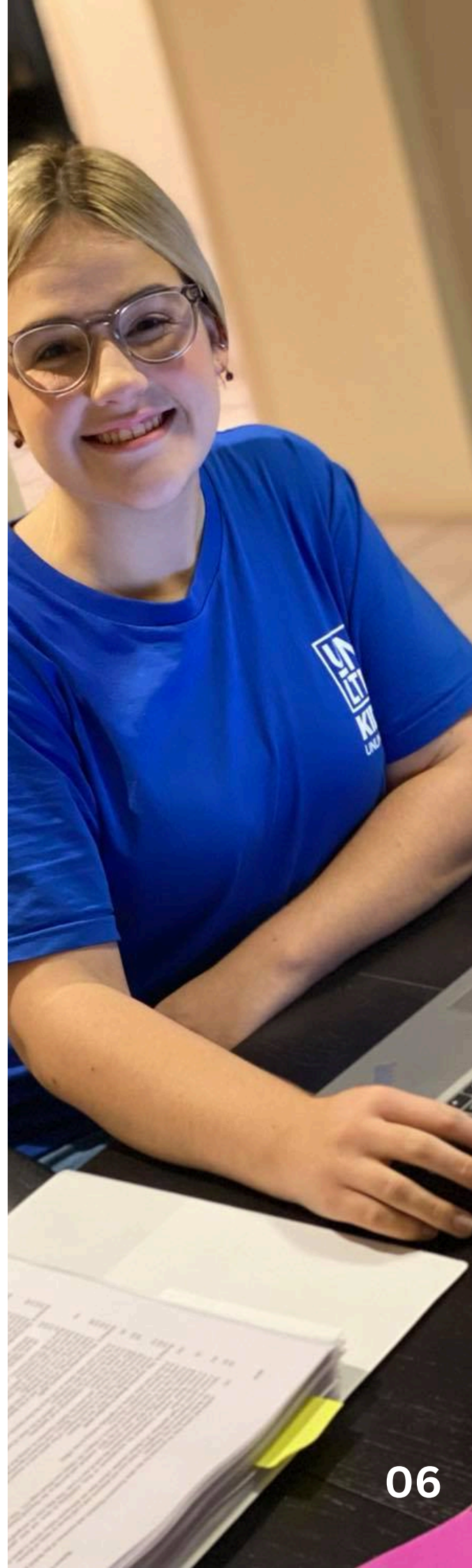
Run through your ritual work, interview questions, and even table manners. The more you practice, the more relaxed and confident you'll feel on stage.

A-Z Tips for Pageant Success

- A. Arrive early** - Being on time shows you're organised and respectful of everyone's schedule. Arriving a little early gives you space to settle in, breathe, and start the day feeling calm.
- B. Be yourself** - Authenticity shines. Don't try to be who you think the judges want, embrace who you are and let that confidence come through.
- C. Confidence is key** - Believe in yourself and your abilities. Even if you feel nervous, stand tall, make eye contact, and give it your best.
- D. Dress appropriately** - Choose outfits that are modest, age-appropriate, and suit the occasion. Your look should reflect pride in representing Job's Daughters.
- E. Eat well** - Start your day with a healthy breakfast so you have energy to keep going. You'll think more clearly and feel better.
- F. Focus on the experience** - this is about more than just winning. Make memories, learn something new, and enjoy the journey.
- G. Good manners matter** - Treat everyone with kindness; judges, organisers, other contestants. People remember how you make them feel.
- H. Hydrate** - Sip water throughout the day so you stay alert and feel your best.
- I. Interview preparation** - Practice speaking clearly and from the heart. Be ready to share your experiences and your thoughts on different topics.
- J. Jewelry** - Keep it simple and elegant so it adds to your look without taking the spotlight.
- K. Keep calm** - Nerves are normal! Take deep breaths, smile, and remind yourself that you've prepared for this.
- L. Listen carefully** - Pay close attention to instructions from the Pageant Team and judges, it shows respect and helps things run smoothly.
- M. Makeup** - Go for a natural look that enhances your features without overpowering them.
- N. Neatness counts** - From your hair to your outfit to your written work, a tidy presentation shows care and attention to detail.
- O. Organisation is essential** - Know where your materials are, keep track of the schedule, and be ready when it's your turn
- P. Practice, practice, practice** - The more you practice your ritual work, interviews, and even walking in your shoes, the more confident you'll be.
- Q. Quality over quantity** - Focus on doing things well, not just doing more.
- R. Respect others** - Be encouraging and supportive of everyone. You're all sharing this experience together.
- S. Smile** - A genuine smile can make you (and everyone around you) feel more relaxed and happier.
- T. Time management** - Give yourself enough time to get ready, practice, and prepare - rushing adds stress
- U. Understand the expectations** - If you're unsure about anything, ask. Knowing what's expected will help you feel prepared.
- V. Voice your thoughts** - In interviews and conversations, share your ideas clearly and confidently.
- W. Wear comfortable shoes** - You'll be on your feet a lot, so choose shoes that look great and feel good.
- X. Expect the unexpected** - Things don't always go to plan, stay flexible and adapt with a positive attitude.
- Y. Yay, you've got this!** Celebrate the little wins throughout the day. You've worked hard to get here.
- Z. Zzzs get plenty of rest** - A good night's sleep before the pageant is one of the best ways to set yourself up for success.
